The "Institut d'Estudis de la Salut" (I.E.S.) (Institute of Health Studies) was established in 1980 in Barcelona by the Department of Health and Social Security (D.H.S.S.) of the Government of Catalonia.

The I.E.S. promotes cooperation between national and international organizations and agencies in the fields of health and social services

The I.E.S. works in close liason with other sections of the Department of Health and Social Security and with health and social service personnel at many levels. It has three main functions:

- 1. To initiate, promote and/or carry out research projects.
- 2. To advise the D.H.S.S.
- 3. To promote and implement further education programmes for health and social services personnel.

Although the I.E.S. receives support from different public and private agencies, most of its activities are directly funded by the Catalan government.

RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

Research activities cover a broad range of interests in the fields of health services, personal social services and public health. Projects funded during the 1983-1984 period dealt with the decrease of fertility rates, epidemiology of leptospirosis, dental health, poverty and inequity, mental health, nutritional behaviour and the demand and supply of health manpower in Catalonia.

Planned activities for the period 1984-1986 will include the following projects:

- Prospective assessment of the need and demand of health manpower.
- Hospital case mix and its effects on health expenditure.
- Rationalization of decision making in primary health.
- Cost-Effectiveness of advanced medical-technology procedures, including new health information systems.
- Design of mathematical simulation models to help in rational decision making.
- Assessment of needs for the Mentally and Physically Handicapped
- Occupational Health.

TEACHING ACTIVITIES

The IES plays a role in post-graduate training for health services and personal social services.

Regular courses at Diploma level in Public Health and Occupational Health are offered to medical doctors, nurses and pharmacists for the 1984-1985 session. Short courses in Epidemiologic Surveillance, Drug Control, Health Education and Health Economics, are also available.

Specific training programs for nurses, pharmacists and personal social services personnel, already working in the health and social services, are offered.

A complete course in Primary Health Care is offered to Doctors and Nurses already working in the field and willing to improve their skills. This course follows a credit system.

ADVISORY ACTIVITIES

IES has organized and supported committees of experts created to deal with relevant policy questions set up by the Department of Health in the fields of diabetes, endemic goiter, high blood presure, manpower ressources planning, and health care technology.
