Thank you for sending me the circular about the A.-C.S. meeting in Oxford, together with the latest information about the International Congress. (I received it only early this month, since it had to be forwarded from London ~ hence my writing almost a month after the 1st March deadline).

I should very much like to attend both the Hispanists' Congress and the A.-C.S., but I shall not know until the very last minute whether or not I can make it. You may perhaps have heard that I have now

as interpreter for Spanish  
become a UN official! (I joined FAO  
some months ago ~ hence the move  
to Rome), and getting to Oxford in  
September involves getting out of being  
sent on a mission elsewhere at that  
same time. This is why I am not  
filling in the attendance/accommodation form,  
but I wanted to warn you that I  
shall do my best to turn up. I will  
then, of course, have to find for myself  
as regards accommodation.

Now that I am getting settled  
again ~ after a number of upheavals ~  
I am arranging things so as to be able  
to undertake some serious "free-lance"  
Hispanic research. For the time being,  
of course, I am mainly concerned with  
picking up the threads of my London  
Ph.D. (now External) on the development

of love theories from Cancionero lyric to  
16th century pastoral.

I have not yet got around to  
contacting Hispanists at the University here  
(what with solving housing problems and  
being ill for a while), but I'm hoping  
to do so very soon, and I've been  
wondering whether I could help with  
some "publicity" for the Hispanists' Congress  
~ and also, of course, for the A.-C.S.  
I am writing a note to Frank Picci  
about this, and you might perhaps let  
me know if there's anyone you think  
I might usefully contact for the A.-C.S.  
(apart from Battilori ~ whom I've never  
met, but who is presumably "an expert"?).
