Thanks very

much for your letter. You are quite right that time is short for the Catalan conference, but this term here has been exhausting with little time for writing & even for thinking.

Fortunately we have the persons for the papers so the programme is practically at hand. The date is the

main question. Lectures start here  
on April 21<sup>st</sup>, but full term begins  
the previous week. So April 2-3 seems  
a suitable date, although I suppose  
the weekend 16-17 could be arranged  
in most cases. This leaves us with  
a little more time & may be  
better.

As for papers, we have:

- 2) G. W. Ribbens: British Travellers  
in Catalonia
- 3) John Elliott: Olivares & the Catalans  
(Fellow, Trinity College, Cambridge)

The three Catalan lecturers in  
the Northern Universities may have  
something to offer. They are: J. Perez  
Ballestar (Glasgow), Ramón Gubern

Saturday morning & afternoon,

I am sending you a parcel

by some friends of the Institut  
d'Estudis Catalans. They left blank  
the space for the address to where  
applications may be sent, leaving  
the matter for us to decide.

I think the Anglo-Catalan Cultural group is the appropriate body to deal with the matter.

They printed this paper in Barcelona without consulting any one in this country, so that it sounds somewhat Catalan English. I do not know whether you may consider circulating this sheet to our members & heads of Departments just as it is or may think more advisable to revise it. But, here again time is a factor.
