Dear Russell-Gebbett,

Many thanks for your long one of yesterday, after Sheffield. To judge from the number of points, you had a pretty busy session!
I'll comment on them with almost telegraphic brevity, if you don't mind.

Accommodation: I've arranged for you & Ribbans to share a room, which means all fourteen 'sleeping' delegates will be in Musgrave House.

Route to Gili's: I'll mark a "British Council" map with all relevant data, for the Hostel notice board; but shall, furthermore, go there to guide you over after dinner on the Friday. [Parenthetically: can you get over here somewhat earlier yourself? We should be delighted if you could come to lunch, or at least to tea, before the mob descends — No.1 Bus to point of intersection with No.2, No.2 to Victoria Road, retrace your steps (sic) for twenty yards, & Hamilton Road will then lie on your left (i.e. on the Bus's right).]

Drinks: 'I'm almost certain that they can't be got at the Hostel (I'll go & ring up). No, they can't, but we may bring our own in (which covers wine at dinner). And there's a very pleasant pub three minutes' away.

And I think that's everything; or at least all that I can answer without an expedition into College, & I'm 'baby-sitting' today as my wife is up in London. Many thanks again for your detailed & highly-entertaining letters (I'm getting a lot of quiet fun out of this conference).
