GENERAL INFORMATION

ANDORRA, a triangular territory of about 188 square miles, is situated between Spain and France, at a latitude of 42°28' North, and a longitude of 0°45' East of the Paris meridian. Its maximum length and breadth are 17 and 18 miles, respectively. Four rivers, several mountain lakes, thermal springs (at LES ESCALDES) particularly suitable for treatment of rheumatism and skin diseases, and a delightful climate, provide suitable "escape" and contrast for the holiday maker wishing to enjoy a few days, or a few weeks, summer or winter, in the high Pyrenean mountains before going down to the sea — as a pleasant detour for tourists going down to the Costa Brava and to Barcelona, in Catalonia, Spain.

Its frontiers are: to the north, the department of Ariège; to the east, the department of the Pyrénées Orientales; and to the south and west the Spanish provinces of Girona and Lleida in the Catalan region. Andorra has a population of about 8,000. The official language is Catalan (as in Catalonia), Spanish and French are also spoken to some extent.

THE VALLEYS OF ANDORRA lie deep in the heart of the Pyrenees. Its government is classified as a "Co-Principality", dating back to 1278 from the "Pariatges" Convention. At present, the Bishop of Urgell and the President of the French Republic, through their permanent delegates (Veguers) are the joint governors. The administrative and juridical system of Andorra is unique, bound by tradition to Catalan and Roman Law. The only private property consists of buildings and farmland - everything else is communaly owned. The inhabitants are an old people, initially composed of ironmasters, shepherds and mountain carriers, and it preserves customs of almost prehistoric origin. However, this has not prevented modernization in many fields, as demonstrated by the intense commercial activity, comfortable hotels (over 90 are listed) excellent tarred roads, several banking establishments, cinemas in a number of towns, ski-lifts, winter ski-ing and many other amenities.

ANDORRA is a country of forests and pastureland, lakes and rivers - among mountain peaks towering to 2500 metres (8200 ft) and over, although never above 3000 metres (9850 ft). Only 4% of the total area is suitable for agriculture. Andorra is a paradise for hunting and fishing - wild-hen, chamois (Isards), trout, vultures and eagles are to be found among its wild life.

Some regions are above the snow line, but even in the heart of winter the temperature sometimes rises above 30° C (86° F.) in the sun. However, in summer the mountain air is cool and at night the thermometer may well drop to freezing point so that the tourist can find his ideal climate somewhere in Andorra at any hour of the day or night.

SUMMER:- During the holiday season, normally from May to September/October, Andorra offers many amenities: Camping sites, gay "Festes" at the six principal villages (see Pink Leaflet for chief dates) with their folk-lore; Roman remains; trout-fishing; pleasant excursions by jeep, bus or on foot for picnics up to the high valleys and mountains; curio shops; night-clubs; the comfort of numerous modern hotels and excellent restaurants - with French, Spanish and Catalan wines and cuisine - catering for all budgets: hotels and pensions range from as low as 10/6d per day up to about £2. Also cinemas, cafés, bars, Sunday football... all set against a spectacular panorama of nature in the rugged high mountains, giving pleasant contrast and providing a holiday, energetic or restful, long or short, to suit everyone.

WINTER SPORTS: In view of the shortage of snow and even the lack of beauty spots at certain well known winter resorts in Europe, Andorra, as far as natural resources are concerned, can offer all that is required of a winter station.

The magnificent CERCLE DELS PESSONS and the VALL D'ENVALIRA, form the zone chosen for skiing purposes. This covers from the MONTMELUS to the COLL DELS CORTALS on the one side, to the COLL BLANC on the other. A number of Spanish skiers resident in Andorra aim at linking up several runs to a total length of about 18 kilometres.

The climatic conditions of the zone are perfect: there is snow for six months, sometimes for as long as $7\frac{1}{2}$ months. The landscape and its facilities for sport and rest offer every attraction to foreign visitors and sportsmen.

The extensive ski-ing zone offers elevation differences of about 800 metres (2625 ft) in courses of less than 3000 metres (9850 ft) long. Beginners will find smooth and easy slopes, for the veteran skier there are the longest courses down to near the village of ENCAMP - about 18 kilometres - and to the borders of SOLDEU - about 5 kilometres.

Skating, ice hockey (on the natural lakes of the CERCLE DELS PESSONS) and Bob-Sleigh courses (at ENCAMP) are next on the schedule of plans for developing winter sports further.

At present four ski-lifts are already in use, a teleski links the village at PAS DE LA CASA with the COLL BLANC; a further teleski connects COLL BLANC down to the GRAU ROIG on the opposite slope, where a further instalation also exists. A further beginners' teleski operates at PAS DE LA CASA.

The above installations are to be completed by linking the GRAU ROIG (at the centre of the CERCLE DELS PESSONS) with the nearest COLL DELS CORTALS, MONTMELUS, using tele-chairs and tele-cabin installations.

It is intended to improve the projected runs by linking them later on with both France and Spain.

The Ski Station is run by Mr. F. Viladomat, Spanish Ski Champion who has represented Spain several times at the Olympic Games; Mr. Viladomat also runs the Ski-ing School.

Andorra has its own ski club - Club de Ski d'Envalira.

TRANSPORT AND HOTELS.

When travelling from FRANCE to ANDORRA by:-

CAR:- French National Highway (Route Nationale No. 20) PARIS TOULOUSE - AX-LES-THERMES - HOSPITALET. Eight kilometres after HOSPITALET when the road forks, take righthand road and 3 Km. farther is the FRENCH-ANDORRAN
border PAS-DE-LA-CASA. French Customs only.

When motoring from ITALY and FRENCH RIVIERA, via
NARBONNE or PERPIGNAN, follow up to PRADES, BOURGMADAME, LA TOUR DE CAROL and up to COL DE PUYMORENS.
Two kilometres after the COL when the road forks, take
left-hand road and a further 3 Km. leads to the FRENCHANDORRAN border - PAS DE LA CASA. French Customs.

Between November and May the COL DE PUYMORENS may be snow-bound. If so, an alternative route via Spain can be taken from BOURG-MADAME to PUIGCERDA (Customs both French and Spanish). From PUIGCERDA to LA SEU D'URGELL (Spanish Customs only) to ANDORRA. (From PUIGCERDA to ANDORRA the detour is about 60 kilometres).

FRENCH RAILWAYS: - Express from GARE DE PARIS-AUSTERLITZ at 8 p.m. This train carries through coaches to AX-LES-THERMES, HOSPITALET and LA TOUR DE CAROL (Gare Internationale). At any of these 3 stations there is a direct Autocar connection for ANDORRA.

Travellers from ITALY of the FRENCH RIVIERA, proceed via NARBONNE, PERPIGNAN, and, LA TOUR DE CAROL (Gare Internationale).

BY AIR:- Cunard-Eagle Airways Ltd., Marble Arch House, 40
Edgware Road, London W. 2. (Tel. AMB 7799) have announced their LONDON-PERPIGNAN flight schedule (Viscount aircraft) as from the 15th May, 1961, every Monday

and Friday, night flight. Return on Tuesdays and Saturdays.

Air Safaris Ltd., and other air lines have services from Great Britain to Perpignan.

From PERPIGNAN to LA TOUR DE CAROL by French Railways (see above).

- AUTOCAR CONNECTIONS: Autocar service connections with French Railways are assured during winter unless the passes at COLL d'ENVALIRA (Andorra) and COL DE PUYMORENS (France) are closed by snow. Whenever the two passes are closed, ANDORRA can be reached via Spain by Autobus from BOURG-MADAME PUIGCERDA LA SEU D'URGELL.

 SUMMER TIME: from May 1st. to 15th November.
- Departure from AX-LES-THERMES during afternoon, on arrival of first train from TOULOUSE. (Ax-les-Thermes/Andorra 6 New Francs). Departure from HOSPITALET, on arrival of the PARIS train (4.50 N. Frcs).
- Departure from ANDORRA-LA-VELLA at 9 a.m. Arrival at AX-LES-THERMES at 11.30 a.m. (Fare 6 N. Francs).

 Departure from ANDORRA-LA-VELLA at about 9 a.m. Arrival at HOSPITA-LET in good time to board the Paris Express connection.

WINTER TIME: Daily autocar connection between PAS-DE-LA-CASA and HOSPITALET and vice-versa, connecting with arrivals and departures of the PARIS trains. This service will be extended up to ANDORRA-LA-VELLA (to and from PAS-DE-LA-CASA Winter Station) whenever the COLL d'ENVALIRA road is kept by the snow-plough.

CUSTOMS AND DOCUMENTS: No Customs formalities whatsoever are carried out by the Andorran authorities when either entering or leaving Andorra. However, both France and Spain do have Customs offices at their own frontiers and may carry out Customs formalities either at exit or entrance. The French Customs check points are at BOURG-MADAME and PAS DE LA CASA. Spanish Customs check points are at PUIGCERDA (International Bridge) and LA FARGA DE MOLES.

No car documents, visas or driving permits are needed when visiting ANDORRA. The documents used for travel in France or Spain are also valid for Andorra.

However, should any tourist wish to have his passport stamped with the Andorran Coat of Arms, he can do so on request from the Order Services (Police) of the Valleys, at their Office at Andorra la Vella. The Officer in Charge will be glad to oblige.

HOTEL LIST is supplied separately. This list gives prices in Spanish pesetas (the official exchange being about 168 pesetas to £1. - 84 pesetas to 10/-, 8.40 pesetas to 1 shilling). Exchange rates of course do vary and the local exchange of Travellers' Cheques is generally as good as in Great Britain or even better.

Advance bookings at hotels are advised if the visit is to be during the summer peak (July/August). Advance bookings can be arranged by writing direct to any of the hotels listed, or through any travel agency.

Hotels and Restaurants are registered with the SINDICAT D'I-NICIATIVA DE LES VALLS D'ANDORRA (Head Office at ANDORRA LA VELLA) and are bound to keep to the registered prices and services. Should any tourist find his hotel or restaurant at fault regarding prices and/or services, he should report to the SINDICAT D'INICIATIVA. Should the establishment be found at fault it would immediately be struck off the register.

Most hotels will make special prices for a long stay or for parties. Some hotels reduce prices in the off season (high season being July-August-September). No hotel taxes are levied in Andorra. All currencies are accepted at the rate of the day, as quoted by the banks. On the general hotels list, whenever two sets of figures are quoted, the first set is the off season price.

WHAT TO SEE ... WHERE TO GO IN ANDORRA.

- THE SANCTUARY OF CANOLIC. Situated at 1500 metres (about 5000 ft) in the Ribera d'Os, the wildest and most rugged of the valleys, 2 hours' walk from Aixovall. The Virgin venerated here is a Romanesque carving of the 13th Century.
- SANTA COLOMA: A Romanesque Church of outstandingly graceful design. The tower is conical and slim, with double-arched windows, dating from the 12th Century. The apse is pre-Romanesque of the 10th Century. It contains a Mozarabic arch with a Romanesque fresco medallion.
- CASA DE LA VALL: The Court of Justice and the Council General of the Valleys Government. This noble building dates from 1580 and contains fine examples of stonework relating to its functions, such as the Coat of Arms, the embrasure, etc. In the main hall there are some interesting paintings of the 17th Century.
- SANT MIQUEL D'ENGOLASTERS:- This Romanesque Church is an hour's walk from Les Escaldes and only half an hour from the lake of the same name. It contains frescoes, and there are some interesting heads of Arabs carved above the upper double arches of the tower.
- SANT ROMA DE LES BONS: Dominating one of the most attractive and interesting settings, among old houses, barns and feudal remains. The tiny church is pre-Romanesque of the 10th or 11th Century, although the porches are rather later. It contains a fine altar-piece of the 16th Century.
- THE SANCTUARY OF MERITXELL: Two images of the Virgin of Meritxell are venerated here, as the Patroness of the Valleys. One of them, a 12th Century Romanesque carving is in the "cambril" or altar-shrine, while the other, a baroque piece, is set on the high altar. The altar-pieces and grilles are also of great interest.
- THE CROSS OF THE SIX ARMS: A stone sculpture in the form of a medallion with a relief carving of Christ. One arm is broken, and there is an ancient legend about it.
- SANT CLEMENTS DE PAL:- This church has a characteristic Romanesque

- bell-tower, lofty and beautiful, with double-coumned windows. It used to contain some fresco paintings of note. It is a typical example of the Romanesque architecture of the Pyrenees.
- CAN PAL DE LA CORTINADA: This is a majestic structure, seigniorial and rustic at the same time, antique and full of character. It is well worth a visit.
- SANT JOAN DE CASELLES:- Is impressive in both its architecture and arrangement. Essentially Romanesque. It contains an altarpiece of the 16th Century and an image of St. John the Apostle of earlier date.
- THE BIRTH OF JESUS (The Living Crib), at ENGORDANY (Les Escaldes). At Christmas and indeed throughout the winter in Engordany, the "Birth of Jesus" is re-enacted in a wonderful natural setting. This is a genuine folk tradition of Andorra.
- Ancient single-arched bridges can be seen along the river both near SANTA COLOMA and the ORDINO way.
- Old FARGUES (ancient iron-smelting works) on the road from LA MAS-SANA to ORDINO, where the remains still show the importance of that craft in the past.
- BORDES (high mountain cattle refuges) are scattered all over the valleys.

MAIN HOLIDAYS ("FESTA" days): The Pink Leaflet gives the "Festa" dates when five of the main villages hold their annual holidays. There is traditional dancing during these holidays at Andorra la Vella and Les Escaldes. FESTA days are spread from July to September.

PETROL: Owing to the negligible tax, petrol is cheaper in Andorra than in France or Spain. The motorist will be well advised to fill up his tanks before leaving Andorra. No French petrol coupons are valid in Andorra.

CUSTOMS: Only France and Spain carry out Customs formalities. Motorists should produce the GREEN CARD at the check points.

DOCTORS AND CHEMISTS: - A modern Clinic and ambulance service take care of the Andorran health services under competent Physicians and Surgeons. Hotels will request the doctors' services whenever necessary.

POSTAL SERVICES: Both France and Spain maintain Post Office services in Andorra. The main offices are at Andorra la Vella. Continually changing sets of Postage Stamps are supplied by both France and Spain.

For correspondence between the Andorran villages no stamps are required as postal services are free.

SHOPS:- Andorra is well provided with shopping centres in the main villages. Curios, and goods from all over the world can be purchased at the Andorran shops.

Winter sports are located at PAS DE LA CASA, ENVALIRA, ENCAMP. Cinemas at LES ESCALDES and ANDORRA LA VELLA. Night-clubs at Encamp (Rosaleda Hotel) and Andorra la Vella (Pyrénées night-club; and Restaurant "La Rotonda", mainly). Swimming pools at the main hotels (see Hotel List).

TRANSPORT SERVICES: Inside Andorra several MICROBUSES (there is no fixed official time schedule) provide BUS services between the main towns. JEEP trips can be arranged through the hotels and local travel agencies in Andorra la Vella.

Private taxi services from Andorra to Barcelona, the Costa Brava, and towns in France can be arranged. Any hotel will provide the necessary information. This office will be glad to recommend some private taxi services which have no official schedules. Tourists can arrange privately for a taxi to collect them in Barcelona or on any town on the Costa Brava or in France and take them to Andorra. Fares in private taxis seating 8, from Andorra to Barcelona, are about £l per head.

BANKS:- The Andorran banks will exchange any currency and travellers cheques at rates as good as in Great Britain, following the day-to-day rates given by Switzerland.
