Dear Mrs. Rose,

I should like to thank you and your staff for your help with the Anglo-Catalan Society Conference at the end of last month. The arrangements went off very smoothly and I am extremely grateful that you made things so easy for me personally as well as so comfortable for members of the Society.

If possible, we should like to hold our next Conference at Canterbury Hall. The dates we have in mind are Friday, 23rd September to Sunday, 25th September 1966. Would you be able to accommodate us for those dates? If so, would you be willing to consider a smaller booking than the Committee made last time? In view of the disappointing attendance of members, we feel that we should like to book for 12 resident members, and I hope that this does not bring the total below a reasonable minimum from your point of view. It does at least have the merit that the figure, though small, is likely to prove realistic.

We are hoping to include a public lecture in the programme for the Conference. This would be given by Mr. A.R. Milburn, a Lecturer in Spanish at Cambridge. We should naturally very much prefer to have this lecture at Canterbury Hall, especially as the concert hall seems ideally suited to this kind of occasion. I realise, however, that there may be some objection on your part because of the regulation about numbers of non-resident as opposed to resident members of the Conference. If you could see your way to allowing the public lecture to take place at Canterbury Hall (assuming that you can take the Conference at all), it would be a great help.

Thank you again for everything you did last time.
