Dear Sr. Alcoverro,

Thank you very much for the total of 3 dozen
CARTELLS you have sent to me, and the two letters accompanying
them. I am also grateful for the copies of the February and
March bulletins. I wonder could you please send me soon
12 more each of the CARTELL and the bulletin for this month;
we have at the moment 36 members, but the circulating list
contains more than this number of names. Could you also
please let me have, when it appears, 4 dozen copies of the
bulletin for April?

Have you circularized all Heads of Departments of Spanish studies in the British universities? If you have not done so, and since the Society always sends details of its activities to these people, I shall be glad to enclose copies of the CARTELL when I inform them of the doming II Conference of the Society. If you would like this done, perhaps you would send me yet more copies of the CARTELL, about 20 more. I imagine that you have already informed a number of the members of the Society, particularly the Catalan ones, of the Jocs, and so also of the II Conference - but I shall have to contact them myself officially. The Committee of the Society does not wish the impression to be given that the two are one and the same thing.

I wonder too if you would mind stating in the next bulleting when this appears, that the II Conference of the Anglo-Catalan Society will be open to them upon payment of the subscription of 10/-. This sum may be paid to the Treasurer of the Society (Geoffrey Ribbans, University Spanish Department, University, Sheffield 10). We would have liked to admit those attending the Jocs free of charge, as guests, but feel that this would not be fair to our members who have already paid more than oncethe sum of 10/-. This also answers your

own query about joining the Society. I am sure that Ribbans will be delighted to have your subscription of 10/-, and we will be more than glad to see you at the II Conference in Cambridge.

In so far as the actual celebration of the Jocs in Christ's College is concerned, I would like to know, for transmission to members of the Society, whether admission is quite free or not. Is there any sort offormality to be gone through, or does one merely go to the College without any sort of authorisation from the Organizers? But I have written to him for full details of what has so far been arranged so that our members may be kept fully informed. I may be able to let you have some sort of provisional programme by about the end of March, but I cannot promise to do so.

There is no stipulation as to the length of the work to be submitted.
