Anglo-Catalan Society. Your plans for a book on Andorra sound very interesting indeed and I hope that they come to fruition. I don't know whether the Society can be of any direct service to you, but it will without doubt be a means of making contact with people who have Catalan and related interests. We should certainly be delighted to have you as a member. I enclose a copy of our broadsheet (which you possibly have already?), an address-list and an announcement of our next Conference, The annual subscription is £1 and this can be paid either to me or to the Treasurer, Dr. P.S.N. Russell-Gebbett whose address you will find on the list.

About your specific enquiries:— As far as I know there is no straight english—Catalan dictionary. There is an old dictionary, published in the 1930's, I think by someone called Vallès, which gives equivalents in about three languages including english. It is out of print now and wasn't too reliable anyway. There are, however, a number of Catalan—Castilian dictionaries which should be useful to you. E. Artells, Diccionari Català—Castellà (2 vols), is cheap but not very exhaustive. Then there are two full—size bilingual dictionaries, one by M. Arimany the other by S. Albertí, which I have found to be generally reliable; botheare called Diccionari Català—Castellà i Castellà—Català, or something very similar. There is a more recent one by Josep Miracle, which should be fuller and more authoritative than these, although I haven't yet seen it myself. All these works are published in Barcelona and are obtainable, probably from stock, from The Dolphin Book Co. Ltd.

IA, Southmoor Road, OXFORD OX2 6RY, or from Messrs Grant and Cutler, II, Buckingham Street, Strand, LONDON WC2N 6DQ. Both these suppliers have good stocks of Catalan books and a very efficient ordering service. You might be interested to hear that Foyles, despite pressure from the Society, have always been reluctant to stock Catalan material. I am sure that you will find Dolphin and Grant and Cutler more helpful.

Do you know that there is a <u>Catalan Grammar</u>, in English, by Joan Gili published by Dolphin? It is quite expensive for what it is - a summary of the basic grammar, followed by an anthology of Catalan literary texts - at over £2, but it might be useful to you. The word-lists which he gives at the end are the nearest thing, so far, to a Catalan-nglish dictionary. I myself am preparing a Catalan volume for the <u>Teach Yourself</u> languages series which should be out in 1973 - 1 am sure you will forgive this plug!
