Sorry for the delay in writing, and sorry too that I haven't been more industrious ~~as~~ the A.C.S. recently.

To deal with first things first: Branson's letter. Frank & I both feel that you are right in thinking we should leave the choice to the I.E.C. - in fact, we might be prepared to go further and suggest Branson's daughter, on the grounds that Romance Philology is perhaps nearer to 'English culture' than Economics. But best perhaps to leave the decision to them, provided that they are to make the choice promptly.
