The Committee has pleasure in informing members that the Annual Luncheon and General Meeting of the Anglo-Catalan Society will be held this year on September 29th, at 12.45 p.m. for 1 o'clock, in the Majorca Restaurant, 66 Brewer Street, London W.1. The cost will be in the region of 10/- per head, excluding wines. The luncheon will be followed by the A.G.M. and the election of officers for the year 1956-7. Will all members, whether or not they are able to attend, please inform the Hon. Secretary, by 22nd September, of any matters they wish to be raised at the A.G.M.; they should also send him any nominations for election to the Committee by the same date. Some points already noted for discussion are 1) the Third Conference of the A-C.S., its date and place; 2) the action taken by the A-C.S. in connection with the cessation of BBC transmissions in Catalan; 3) the action taken by the A-C.S. in connection with the many requests received by members and friends for information about accommodation and employment in this country for young people from the Peninsula; 4) the action taken by the A-C.S. with a view to establishing a scholarship in this country open to Catalan-speaking university graduates; 5) the proposed visit to this country of Dr. and Mrs. Carles Riba. 
