The Fourth Conference.

As resolved at the last Annual General Meeting, the Fourth Conference of the Society will be held in Belfast during the week-end Friday, 28 March, to Sunday, 30 March. Accommodation has already been booked for the Society at Queen's Elms, one of the Halls of Residence of The Queen's University of Belfast. Members will hardly need to be reminded that Belfast is the home of our distinguished member, Professor I. Gonzalez-Llubera, doyen of Spanish and Catalan studies in the United Kingdom.

The proceedings of the Conference will commence with a reception at 7.30 p.m. on Friday evening at the University. Formal meetings and the reading of papers will begin on Saturday morning and the Conference will end on Sunday afternoon. A special dinner will be arranged at Queen's Elms for Saturday evening. The tariff for residence at Queen's Elms (excluding the dinner on Saturday evening) will be in the region of £3.3s.0d for two nights' stay and meals up to and including lunch on Sunday. Further details of the Conference will be circulated to members at a later date.

Members willing to read papers at the Conference are invited to submit titles and abstracts to me for consideration by the Committee at the earliest possible date and in no case later than 28 February. Papers should be limited to a duration of about twenty minutes to allow time for a full discussion. Contributions have already been promised by Professor Llubera and Mr. J. Gili.

Will all members who intend to be present at the Conference kindly send me the appended slip before 28 February. This does not commit the senders in any way nor necessarily preclude late acceptances, but it is merely intended to give me some idea of the numbers who may be expected to attend.

Travel arrangements to Belfast.

There are daily main line trains to Belfast from London (Euston) with steamer connections at Liverpool or Heysham. Berths should be booked early from any travel agency. For those attending the Hispanists' Conference in Dublin earlier in the week there is a good train service to Belfast. British European Airways makes several daily flights from London or Manchester direct to Belfast.
